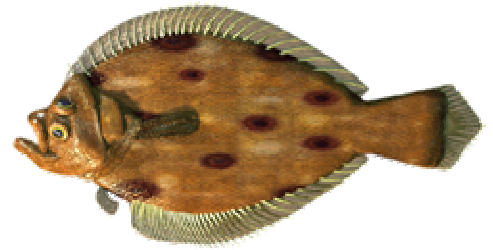


ROALD DAHL. BOY.

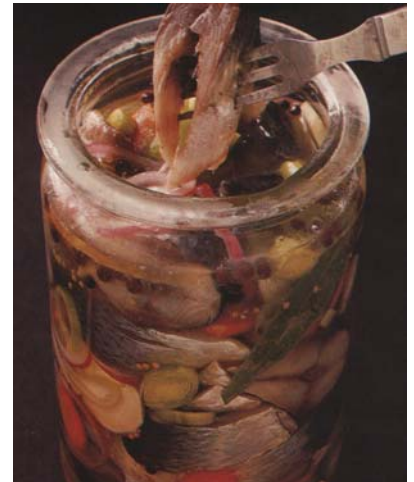

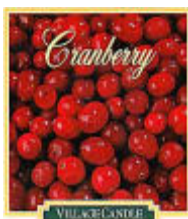
